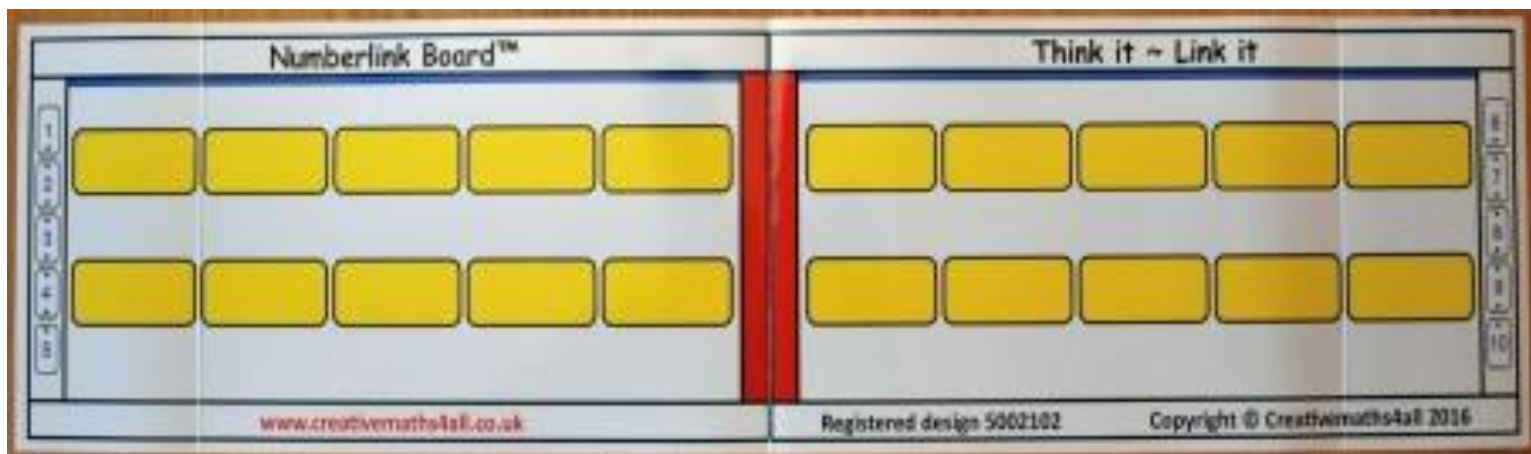


What can you do at home?

- **Chant times tables** with your children. They need be confident writing and saying them in order before they can recall them out of order.
- Spend time on the **retrieval homework** with your child each week
 - These are designed to be done every day as regular retrieval has been found to work best.
- Encourage the use of **TTRS** – smaller regular chunks of time work best
- **Quick retrieval sessions** in the car, walking to school etc.
- Show them **what they know** and how they can use these facts to work out the trickier facts.
 - The facts furthest away from 5 and 10 (7,8,12) are the hardest to calculate so focus on these when they become more confident.



Tricky times table facts. These are the ones that seem to be the hardest facts to grasp and remember.

$$6 \times 8 = 48$$

$$11 \times 12 = 132$$

$$8 \times 12 = 96$$

$$8 \times 7 = 56$$

$$12 \times 9 = 108$$
