
## What can you do at home?

- Chant times tables with your children. They need be confident writing and saying them in order before they can recall them out of order.
- Spend time on the **retrieval homework** with your child each week
  - These are designed to be done every day as regular retrieval has been found to work best.
- Encourage the use of TTRS smaller regular chunks of time work best
- Quick retrieval sessions in the car, walking to school etc.
- Show them **what they know** and how they can use these facts to work out the trickier facts.
  - The facts furthest away from 5 and 10 (7,8,12) are the hardest to calculate so focus on these when they become more confident.



**Tricky times table facts**. These are the ones that seem to be the hardest facts to grasp and remember.

$$6 \times 8 = 48$$

$$8 \times 12 = 96$$

$$8 \times 7 = 56$$

$$12 \times 9 = 108$$
